



JOHN HOLLAND CRYSTAL VISION AWARD

Purpose and Recognition

The Crystal Vision Award celebrates the achievement of individuals, businesses or organisations that actively promote and encourage participation and career progression of women in the construction or related industries. This award celebrates the continuing commitment towards advancing the interests of women in the construction industry as a whole using examples such as establishing policies, supporting legislation and creating unique organisational initiatives.

Eligibility

Any individual, business or organisation residing or operating in Queensland associated with the construction, property and related industries.

Nominations for this award may be made by a nominee or a third party, provided that the nominee(s) has provided their consent to the nomination.

Submissions Questions, & Word Count

1. Leadership & Strategy (500 words)

Describe how the foresight of the nominee, business or organisation is making the construction industry better and more inclusive. Describe their vision, and how they have worked towards achieving it. This may include any challenges the nominee, business or organisation has faced and how they were overcome.

2. Demonstrated Outcomes (500 - 1000 words)

Describe the impact that the nominee has had in working towards a more diverse and inclusive industry.

This may include:

- Encouraging and empowering women in the construction industry by establishing company policy or by initiating legislative changes or other changes to an organisational structure benefiting women in construction;
- Achieving a position of significance and authority which has enabled them to influence and/ or make policy decisions that are beneficial to women in the construction industry;
- Showing leadership in implementing initiatives for the betterment of women in construction;

- Successfully breaking barriers with a 'first' for women in the construction industry;
- Showing a significant commitment to, and making a lasting impact on, the construction industry during their career.

3. Provide two references to support this nomination

4. Summary of Submission (300 words)

Provide a description of the nominee, business or organisation. If applicable, provide a description of the relevant team within the business or organisation, or the nominee's role within the team for individual nominations. State if this is a self-nomination, or if you are nominating someone else. To be written in the third person (this will be used in the Awards presentation and eBook).

5. Nominee biography (300 words)

Should have emphasis on the nominee's participation and achievements in the construction industry.

Supporting Information – These must be included with the nomination

- Letter of Consent All entries relating to or describing work on a project or property must include a letter of consent from the project owner agreeing to the property / project being entered in the Awards and photographs of the project being used for the purpose of the Awards
- Declaration Form All entries must complete and sign the Declaration Form
- Headshot A good quality professional image of the nominee *
- Three good quality images of the project, or relevant to the nomination *
- Video footage of the nominee at work including a piece-to-camera introducing themselves, their role and company and why they were nominated *

WILEY AWARD FOR ACHIEVEMENT AS A BUSINESS WOMAN

For the achievement of a businesswomen in the construction, building or related industries who play a pivotal role in a company, partnership or organisation.

Purpose and Recognition

This award recognises achievements of women in construction, building or related industry organisations who make a significant contribution to the creation, development or growth of a construction or development related business.

Eligibility

Any woman who is a senior manager, director, owner, partner or paraprofessional of an organisation in Queensland in the construction, building or related industries is eligible for this award. Irrespective of title, the individual must play a substantial role as a decision-maker within the organisation.

Nominations for this award may be made by a nominee or a third party, provided that the nominee has provided their consent to the nomination.

Nominees must be NAWIC financial members at time of nomination and award ceremony.

AWARD FOR ACHIEVEMENT IN HEALTH AND SAFETY AND/OR ENVIRONMENT

For the achievements of women who have contributed to Health and Safety and/or Environment in the construction or related industries.

Purpose and Recognition

This award recognises achievements of women who have contributed to Health and Safety in the construction or related industries and demonstrated best practice through a health and safety initiative.

Eligibility

Any woman who holds a role in the construction or related industries which relates directly to health and safety or environment and may be an employee, business owner or consultant.

Nominations for this award may be made by a nominee or a third party, provided that the nominee has provided their consent to the nomination.

Nominees must be NAWIC financial members at time of nomination and award ceremony.

QUEENSLAND GOVERNMENT AWARD FOR SUSTAINABILITY AND ENERGY

For the contribution to sustainable practices and/or energy to the environment within the construction, building or related industries.

Purpose and Recognition

This award recognises women who have made contributions to sustainability and/or energy environment.

Eligibility

Any woman who is an employee, business owner or consultant in the construction or related industries is eligible for this award. Nominees may be an employee, business owner or consultant.

Nominations for this award may be made by a nominee or a third party, provided that the nominee(s) has provided their consent to the nomination.

Nominees must be NAWIC financial members at time of nomination and award ceremony.

SEYMOUR WHYTE AWARD FOR ACHIEVEMENT IN CONSTRUCTION (CIVIL WORKS)

For the outstanding achievements and contributions of women undertaking civil works.

Purpose and Recognition

This award recognises women who have made contributions to civil construction works.

Eligibility

Any woman who is an employee, business owner, consultant, machine operator or paraprofessional in the construction or related industries is eligible for this award.

Nominations for this award may be made by a nominee or a third party, provided that the nominee(s) has provided their consent to the nomination.

Nominees must be NAWIC financial members at time of nomination and award ceremony.

CSQ TRADIE OF THE YEAR

For the outstanding achievements and contributions of women undertaking a trade.

Purpose and Recognition

This award encourages significant contributions of women undertaking a trade in the construction, building or related industries

Eligibility

Any woman currently undertaking a trade relevant to the construction, building or related industry is eligible for this award.

Nominations for this award may be made by a nominee or a third party, provided that the nominee(s) has provided their consent to the nomination. However, the nomination must be written by the nominee. No ghost writing is permitted in this award.

Nominees must be NAWIC financial members at time of nomination and award ceremony.

CORRS CHAMBERS WESTGARTH AWARD FOR DIVERSITY

For the outstanding achievements and contributions of women, men, companies or groups who encourage and support diversity in the workplace.

Purpose and Recognition

This award recognises an individual (regardless of gender) or an organisation or group, that has demonstrated a significant commitment to increasing diversity and inclusion in their workplace or organisation.

Eligibility

Open to any individual, firm, partnership, company, or organisation within the construction or related industries. The nominee may be in any role or discipline.

Nominations for this award may be made by a nominee or a third party, provided that the nominee(s) has provided their consent to the nomination.

Nominees must be NAWIC financial members at time of nomination and award ceremony.

This award celebrates their contribution, potential to inspire and influencing change within the construction, building or related industry.

Eligibility

Any woman who is under the age of 35 and is an employee, business owner or consultant in the construction, building or related industries is eligible for this award. The nominee may be in any role or discipline.

Nominations for this award may be made by a nominee or a third party, provided that the nominee(s) has provided their consent to the nomination.

Nominees must be NAWIC financial members at time of nomination and award ceremony.

Any woman who is an employee, business owner, consultant, tradesperson, site-based role or paraprofessional in the construction or related industries is eligible for this award.

Nominations for this award may be made by a nominee or a third party, provided that the nominee(s) has provided their consent to the nomination.

Nominees must be NAWIC financial members at time of nomination and award ceremony.

Nominees must be NAWIC financial members at time of nomination and award ceremony.

This award recognises achievement in delivering innovative design which responds effectively to the client brief. This may include architecture, interior design, landscape architecture, urban design, transport design, artistic design, heritage design or engineering achievements.

Eligibility

Any woman in the construction or related industries who has contributed to the design of a project in Queensland that has reached practical completion or a significant milestone is eligible for this award.

Nominations for this award may be made by a nominee or a third party, provided that the nominee(s) has provided their consent to the nomination.

Nominees must be NAWIC financial members at time of nomination and award ceremony.

Assessment Criteria

 - a. Innovation, technical complexities, unusual or unique features of the project.
 - b. Nature of the exceptional design contribution(s) made by the nominee to meet the brief.
 - c. Incorporation of sound design principles (i.e., how it is considered sustainable development, the impact on consumers, communities, owners, the environment etc.).
 - d. Evidence of effective consultation or communication undertaken with key stakeholders and how this influenced design development.
- 4. A summary of the impact/legacy achieved by the design, including its impact on the environment, local community, end-users and other key stakeholders (400 words).
- 5. Best Practice in Design how you achieved.
- 6. Detail how the nominee has been a role model for other women in the industry (350 words).
